Saint Louis University and YouGov surveyed 900 likely Missouri voters from February 8 to February 14 about current political issues, gun policy, and education policy in Missouri. The following pages present results for most survey questions. The margin of error for survey results for the full sample is 3.72%. Methodology and Weighting

YouGov interviewed 1126 respondents with 998 completing the full survey. YouGov conducted a benchmarking survey of Missouri Likely voters using a census click methodology, which involves sampling in such a way that all starts to a particular survey are representative of the known demographic characteristics of a specific target group. In this case, YouGov sampled so all starts were representative of Missouri registered voters population, as defined by the 2020 Current Population Survey (CPS) November.

The sample of all starts was matched from 1015 respondents to 900 completes, yielding a target subsample of 900 MO likely voters. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education. The sampling frame is a politically representative "modeled frame" of US adults, which was then subsetted to only include MO likely voters. It is based upon the American Community Survey (ACS) public use microdata file, public voter file records, the 2020 Current Population Survey (CPS) Voting and Registration supplements, the 2020 National Election Pool (NEP) exit poll, and the 2020 CES surveys, including demographics and 2020 presidential vote.

The matched cases were then weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined, and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, and education. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame, and post-stratified according to these deciles.

The weights were then post-stratified on 2016 and 2020 Presidential vote choice, as well as a four-way stratification of gender, age (4-categories), race (4-categories), and education (4-categories). From there, the matched and weighted cases had all MO likely voters extracted, and their weights centered around 1 in order to produce the final dataset.

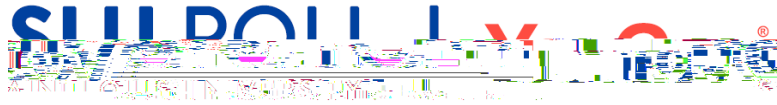

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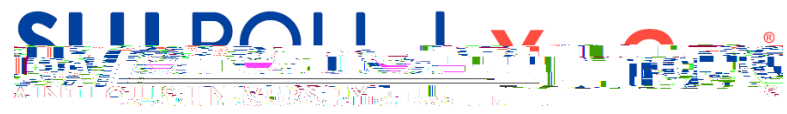

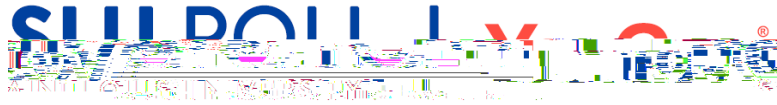

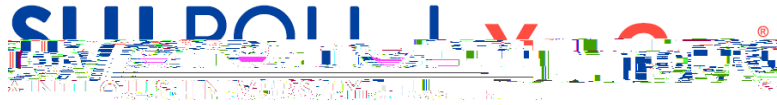

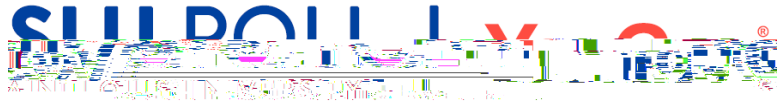

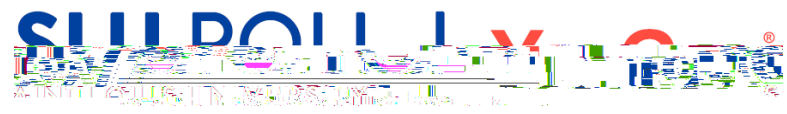

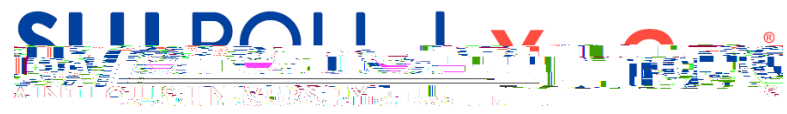
